Outline: The proposed land development on our western fringe covers some of the area severely impacted by bushfire in 2003. Those fires on our side of the Murrumbidgee River were extremely swift and unstoppable. The main fire front travelled in part through the rural landscape where it was fuelled by pine plantations, grasslands and weeds. I maintain that although the pines are gone, other fuels remain including widespread blackberry infestations such as we once had on the western slopes of Mt Stromlo between plantations. Blackberry and thistles, also escaped oats, are very volatile in hot dry windy conditions. All crops including scrubby regrowth offer the same threat of continuous combustion on the worst bushfire days with the fire front travelling across the landscape at the average wind speed.

The aim was to capture any contrast in the ground fire progress assuming the wind on the day was over my RH shoulder and from the direction of the Murrumbidgee in NSW.

This assumption required the fire to have travelled through the treeless pastures seen from William Hovell Drive. This end of the fire front was still on Pig Hill about 10 am Saturday as seen from Goodwin Hill trig in Macgregor.

In my opinion, the ACT Government does not have the manpower and the community does not have the authority to manage our expanding urban fringe on a season to season basis. Any change to the Territory Plan must allow for a broader attack on the constant weed regrowth in remaining woodlands and pastures. Handing the bushfire risk to developers should include selling the risk to future residents on larger blocks round the interface. All residents should have an obligation to promote enduring wild life populations by encouraging suitable habitat. ACT authorities should ensure the region remains fertile by a constant watch on soils and water in the absence of farmers and traditional owners.
